Football

Graduation of seniors at key positions have left huge holes in the Kingston House football team for 1969. Gone are ace quarterback R. Peter Kushner, Halib (Eppson) Saltz, Mark (Beanie) Bernstein, Lippy Cohen, Howard Schmoel Elson, and Furricane Harry Nass. The team is bolstered by returning veterans. Kid Mandel, Kingston's 1969 defensive captain, is back for his 27th season. THE Gern, Gary Greenfield, George (Rostie) Rozansky, Harlan (Harmon) Wolfson, sometimes called Clele, Mike (16-14) Hecht, Ira (T. Glosch) Gluck, Steve (Travis) Strachman, Ronnie (Flea) Elwood, Dave Robbins, and Bob Lesser make up nucleus of the squad.

Captain Ronnie Elwood looks to the rookies for help. Among the newcomers is highly touted Mickey (Duke Nitz) Kramnitz, a bonus baby from Dayside. Lead Mark Daniels will provide depth at guard. Other rookies include, Barry Dimmel, or Himmel, Mark Mischler, with a good shot at safety or end, Eddie Weiss, Artie Spar, and Al Greenbaum.

Last season was one of the finest for the men of Kingston on the gridiron. The season started with a romp over Eganer House, followed by a last second win over a strong Regal team. Disaster struck early when State House defeated Kingston 13-2 in a hotly contested ballgame. The Kingston squad got together as they went all the way in the loser's division with successive victories over Bamboo, Crown and Random. Then came the second meeting with State House for the Championship. Kingston had to win twice. As the fickle finger of fate would have it, Rick Kushner was out of the game and Kingston went with Gary Greenfield at QB. Despite a fine effort by Kingston and the Gern, Kingston was downed 1-6, and once again were bridesmaids. State House played their usual fine game and proved that they deserved the trophy.

This season, Kingston looks to T. Gern and the Kid for much needed veteran experience. They may provide the spark that could ignite the team. Returning to the right guard spot is Dave Robbins, who was hampered by an ankle injury last season. Duke Kramnitz holds down the other side of the line. Center is a problem this season because of the long-awaited departure of Mark Bernstein. Artie Spar and George Rozansky will fight it out for the position. The defensive line is going to be tough. Kramnitz, Gern, and Rozansky make up the Terrible Threesome. The linebacking is shaping up with Mike Hecht, the only veteran there, Kid Mandel, and Bob Lesser. Mandel turned down an offer to jump leagues and has decided to play for the Kingston squad this season. Returning to his left safety spot will be Flea Elwood, with Mark Mischler, Paul Karchawer, and Bobby Gans fighting to take over Mandel's old position. These four can really fly and are a good bet to prevent against the bomb. The linebacking is the key to the defense. If it fails, Kingston will be tough. Back on offense, the halfbacking will be handled by Gary Greenfield and Travis Strachman, with Bruce Mandel in reserve. We'll pause here for a word about Steve Strachman. Here, along with Rick Kushner, in last year's victory over Regal House, Strachman is a real asset to any club. A good blocker, a fine runner, slippery when in motion, he definitely will help the club.

The depth of the squad is evident as shown by the excess of fine receivers. The corps is headed by Harmon Wolfson, sure handed Bob Lesser and Ronnie Elwood, voted last year's Rookie of the Year. These three are backed up by Mark Mischler, Paul Karchawer, Mike Hecht, and Al Greenbaum.

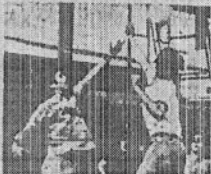

With this new Volleyball season approaching, we have every confidence we will be able to duplicate last year's performance. Why don't you join us and become part of the winning team?

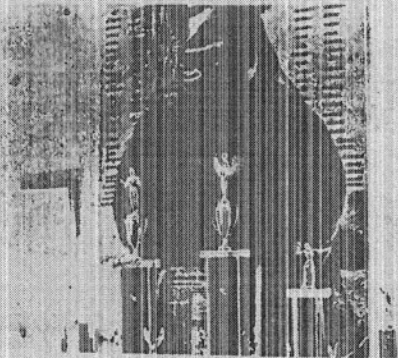
Basketball
